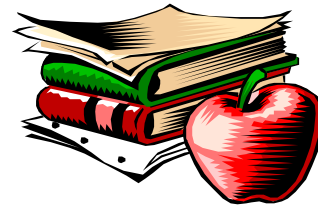

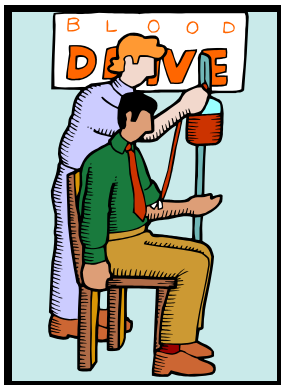

Rocket Man

Retired NASA scientist urges students to seize opportunities

Retired NASA scientist James E. Smith offered living proof to Jesse Stuart Elementary School students Thursday afternoon that with hard work, they can achieve their dreams.

Smith grew up as part of a family with 11 children in Yazoo City, Miss., a town about the size of Madisonville.

"I grew up in a very poverty-stricken area," he told the fourth- and fifth-graders gathered in the gym. "We were very poor, didn't have much."

His parents had only gone to school through eighth grade, and he and his siblings weren't sure they would all earn high school diplomas. The schools, at that time, were still segregated in Mississippi.

Smith's eyes were on space.

As a child, he would lie on top of his dad's car and look up at the stars. He also kept up with the moon phases. Unlike now, that wasn't done using a computer.

"I had to go outside at night and study that on my own," he said.

After watching the 1969 moon landing, Smith decided he wanted to work for NASA.

"I took all the math, all the science — chemistry and physics — courses," he said. "Mama and Daddy couldn't help me. I had to study and learn this on my own."

However, Smith didn't go directly to college from high school.

Two years after graduation, he ran into his high school principal, who asked why he wasn't in college. She connected him with people at Mississippi Valley State University.

With her backing, he received grants and work/study.

He also became a co-op student for NASA, working at Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Ala.

He joined NASA full time in 1975.

For the first few years, Smith worked with Skylab flight film and data. From 1979-2007, he ran the Marshall Solar Vector Magnetograph — observing three 11-year solar cycles and processing the data.

For the last couple of years, he worked in the engineering test laboratory, testing and designing rocket engines.

He retired Jan. 1 after 37 years with the agency.

Smith started his school

presentations Wednesday, and they will conclude today.

As Smith spoke Thursday, videos of solar activity played on the screen behind him.

Students asked multiple questions: How are space ships made? How much power is needed to get it into space? What happens to things in a black hole? How powerful is a solar flare? How long does it take the space shuttle to get into space?

Smith provided the answers. When the presentation ended, students still had their hands up wanting to ask more questions.

He hopes students will be inspired to follow their dreams.

"I'm here to encourage you today," he said. "Some of you are in poor families, also, but I'm here to encourage you."
