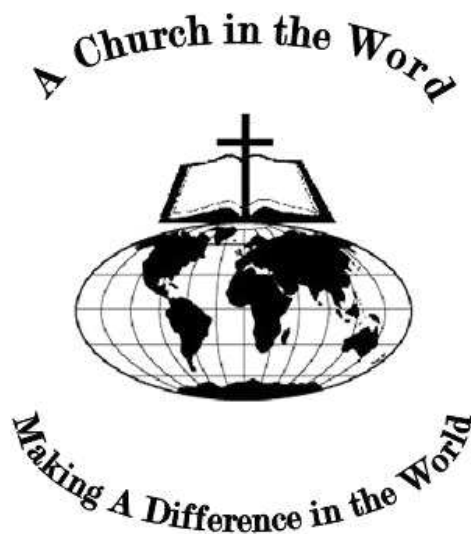

K 5 Graduates

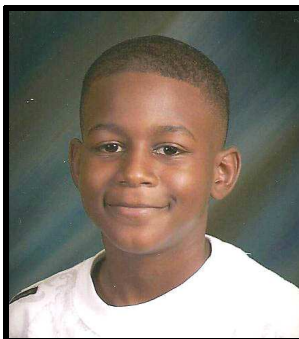

In this first year as a member of the Lady Blazers she continues to pull in the honors. At the UAB women's basketball team end of the year banquet, Jala was named the Blazer of the Year, the team's most valuable player award. Additionally she was named Conference USA (C-USA) Freshman and Sixth Player of the Year, becoming the first player in league history to earn both honors in the same season ... also named second team All-C-USA and to the C-USA All-Freshman Team ... received C-USA All-Tournament honors ... earned C-USA Freshman of the Week five times during the season ... set a school record for freshmen with 103 assists ... averaged 15.8 ppg, 3.1 rpg and 3.2 apg ... scored 25 points in her collegiate debut ... also grabbed nine rebounds and went 7-of-8 from the stripe ... nearly notched a triple-double against MVSU with 16 points, nine rebounds and nine assists ... scored 20 points, including a 4-of-5 performance from behind the arc, against UCF earning her a third C-USA Freshman of the Week honor ... became the first player in C-USA history to earn three straight weekly awards after receiving Freshman of the Week honors on Jan. 25 for her then-career-high 26-point performance against Houston ... knocked



down four 3-pointers for the third straight game and scored 24 points against East Carolina ... became the first freshman in C-USA history to score 40 points in a game against Marshall ... knocked down a career-best five 3-pointers in the contest ... finished the season with 24 double-digit games. 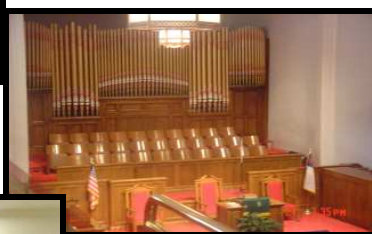
